## “God’s Will”

III John 2-4 (KJV)

I John 5:13-15 (KJV)

“According to His will”

- Faith begins and ends where the will of God is known.
- God’s Word is His will (both written and living)
  - a) Scriptures = God’s Will
  - b) Jesus = God’s Will

Hebrews 10:5-7 (KJV)

- Jesus came to do God’s Will
- He came to reveal and execute God’s will

John 4:31-34 (KJV)

.... do the will of Him that sent me

John 5:14-20 (Pool of Bethesda)

- vs. 6-13 Jesus heals this man on the Sabbath
- (ref) Tells him to take up his bed and walk
- Jews said it was unlawful to carry his bed on the Sabbath
- (Men love their doctrines more than people)

vs. 14-20 (KJV) Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon them.

vs. 30 (KJV) Seek not His own will, but the will of the Father

John 6:38-40 (KJV)

God’s will not His own

John 14:6-14 (KJV)

- Luke 22:42 (ref)  
“Not My will, but Thine be done.”
- Hebrews 1:3 (ref) .... brightness of His glory, express image of His person
- Colossians 2:9 (ref) .... fullness of the Godhead dwells in Jesus

Examples

1. The leper – Matthew 8:1-3 (KJV)

.... touched him, saying .... “I WILL”

No hesitation

Did not pray

Why? It’s always God’s will to heal.

2. The Centurion – Matthew 8:5-13 (KJV)

“.... I will come and heal him.”

No hesitation

Did not even pray

- Hebrews 13:8 (ref) Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever.

- James 5:14 (ref) Any sick among us?

Call for the elders

Anoint with oil

Prayer of faith will save the sick

The Lord will raise him up

Sins will be forgiven
