

Knowing the Holy Spirit – 4 of 4
“Baptism with the Spirit”

REVIEW

1. Holy Spirit is a PERSON. (1 John 5:7)
2. Holy Spirit is like the WIND. (Multiple manifestations)
3. There are THREE different BAPTISMS. (Hebrews 6:2)
Spirit baptizes us in the body.
Pastor or leader baptizes us with water.
Jesus baptizes us with the Spirit.

Ephesians 4:1-6 (NKJV) - One Baptism?

- Only one baptism saves us (1 Corinthians 12:12-14).
- Only one baptism makes us part of the body (Christ)
- Only one baptism gives us all one Father – who is over us all.
- Only one baptism gives us the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

BAPTISM WITH THE SPIRIT

Luke 20:1-4 (NKJV) - Who is the authority on these matters?

1. John the Disciple - wrote book of John (I, II, III John) and Revelation.
2. John the Baptist – authority from God.
3. Luke - Beloved physician (Colossians 4:14)
Close friend and companion of Paul
Wrote the book of Luke and Acts
4. Paul – Apostle and writer of many epistles.
5. Peter – Disciple, Pastor and close friend of Jesus.
6. Jesus – Wow! Final Authority

John 1:29-34 (NKJV)

1. Jesus would take away our sin.
2. Jesus would baptize us with the Holy Spirit (Both Johns are a witness)

Luke 24:36-49 – Jesus appears to his disciples

Luke 24:44-49 (NKJV)

Vs. 49 – Promise of my Father...

Acts 1:1-5 (NKJV)

Vs. 4 – Promise of the Father...

Vs. 5 – The baptism of the Holy Spirit is the promise

Acts 2:1-4 (NKJV)

Actual Event

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit (Baptism or the promise)

Acts 2:37-39 (NKJV)

Vs. 38 ...receive the gift of the Holy Spirit

Vs. 39 ...the promise is...

No shelf-life. No expiration date by any biblical authority

Luke wrote this (witness).

Peter said this (another witness).

Acts 8:5-12 – Phillip preaches in Samaria

They believed the message and were baptized (saved)

Acts 8:14-17 (NKJV)

Peter and John (authorities)

Acts 11:15-18 (NKJV) - Peter Visits Cornelius' House

Vs. 15 Cornelius and his house experience the same thing as the 120 in Acts 2:4

Vs. 16 Peter called it the baptism with the Holy Spirit

Acts 19:1-7 – Apostle Paul at Ephesus

Vs. 5-7 (NKJV)

TAKE AWAY

1. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is biblical and is relevant today.
2. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is the promise of the Father.
3. The baptism of the Holy Spirit is a gift – RECEIVE IT!
